

Welcome to JordanCon! Ostensibly, you're here because you're a fan of Robert Jordan's best-selling series, The Wheel of Time. However, whether that is true or you're here as a fan of Brandon Sanderson, in preparation for the upcoming Amazon TV series, or even just here to support a friend, we want to make sure you enjoy your experience. There's an awful lot to take in, and we only get 3 days, so we've built several guides over the years. In this welcome packet, we've included information from each of those guides to ease your worries, and help you plan your time wisely.

For many of our new members, this may not just be their first JordanCon, but their first Con in general. In that light, we'll start out by talking about some terms you may hear or see:

Tracks – A track is the name given to a specific room or rooms generally being used for similarly themed panels.

Panels – A panel is a staff or guest led discussion about a particular topic.

CosPlay – A portmanteau of the words Costume and Play. It is a mix of dressing up as a character and role-playing as that character to some degree.

Art Show – We have a track dedicated entirely to our wonderful artists! From here you can admire the work of our many talented artists (including voting on your favorite in a variety of categories), purchase a variety of different styles of art, or even participate in some panels regarding the making and selling of artwork. Did I mention you can vote on your favorite works in the Art Show? Vote.



Workshops – Learn a variety of trades and crafts from masters! Most of these workshops will include separate registration as class size is limited, make sure to check with registration first thing and see what is still available! Fees may apply, be sure to inquire at registration!

GoH – Short-hand for Guest of Honor. We have an Author and Artist Guest of Honor each year.

ConSuite – A room reserved by the Con Staff for members to stop by for refreshments, or just to take a break between panels.

Ribbons – For a variety of reasons, you may be gifted a ribbon that can be adhered to your badge. These are little trophies that can be collected as you wander around the Con, and you should always keep an eye out for new ways to earn ribbons!

Charity Auction – Every year we auction off items, all donated by members or guests, and the proceeds are donated to charity. This year's charity will be the Hospice of Mercy, in memory of Steve Godecke. Located in room Maplewood B. Our auction will run from 9 AM until 7 PM on Saturday



Steve Godecke – Bear with us if you hear this name and we get a little emotional... Steve was the Director of Videography for JordanCon, having earned himself that spot when he showed up to the very first JordanCon with his equipment and just asked where to set up. His passion for Wheel of Time, his kind hearted nature, and his immensely positive attitude in the face of adversity were all unparalleled. Steve's passing earlier this month has left our world just a little less bright. In his memory, we donate to the Hospice of Mercy all of our charity proceeds this year.

Team Jordan – The term used to describe the group of people who made this all possible: Harriet McDougal, Maria Simons, and Alan Romanczuk.



Harriet Stoney Popham McDougal was born in Washington D.C. and grew up in Charleston from the age of three. Returning to Charleston in 1977, she founded her own publishing imprint, Popham Press, and later became the original Editorial Director of Tor Books, an imprint of Tom Doherty Associates. In the course of her work she met James Rigney, a Charleston-born writer, and married him in 1981. Under the pen name Robert Jordan, he wrote the bulk of his fantasy series The Wheel of Time, the best known of his many works. (Harriet was editor of all but one of his books.) He died before the series was completed. Harriet engaged Brandon Sanderson to finish the series , which he did under her editing. She is one of the authors of The Wheel of Time Companion, and has also published her poetry in several small magazines.



Maria Simons won her dream job in 1996: working for Robert Jordan, the author of The Wheel of Time, her favorite series of books. She started out working twelve hours a week, answering fan mail and filing, but the job quickly evolved, and she added other tasks such as cataloging RJ's extensive library and researching topics such as sheep-shearing. Eventually, she convinced RJ that she didn't mind being spoiled for WoT, and beginning with volume eight, The Path of Daggers, she became continuity editor for the series. After Robert Jordan's untimely death in 2007, Maria continued working for his editor and widow, Harriet McDougal. Along with Harriet and Alan Romanczuk, she worked with Brandon Sanderson to complete the final three books of the series. Harriet, Alan and Maria (aka Team Jordan) then wrote The Wheel of Time Companion. Maria continues to work for Harriet, and intends to continue for as long as she's wanted.



Alan worked with RJ and Bandersnatch for 16 years before retiring at the end of 2017. While there he assisted with research and continuity on the Wheel of Time series, paid bills, cleaned gutters, built and maintained company computers and networks. After RJ's death he was privileged to work with the rest of Team Jordan and Brandon Sanderson in completing the last three books in the WoT series and was co-author of The Wheel of Time Companion.

Helpful Hints, Guidelines, and Words of Wisdom

 go to the Con, and they bring with them their own special regional illnesses. You don't want to
 leave JordanCon and then get sick, your boss will be very mad and blame all of us and that's just
 not fair.
- VOLUNTEER I can't stress this enough, you should volunteer. This is absolutely the best way to get to know other people at the con and get to know your way around. Once you start, you won't be able to stop, it's so much fun being a part of the process!





- Dress Comfortably it sure is fun to dress up! Just remember that you're going to be walking around and on your feet for the entire day. So, wear comfortable shoes whenever you're able. Keep in mind, you're going to be inside most of the day, and the weather may be warm outside... but inside? That's another story. Easy to remove outer layers are a good call here, so you can transition easily if you get too cold or too hot!
- Remembering details in all the hustle and bustle can be difficult. Write things down! Start a note on your phone or use this handy folder we've provided and store notes! You don't want to forget your friends room number, or where the ConSuite is!
- Are you a hugger? That's awesome! Some of us aren't... so just make sure you ask before you go around grappling everyone! It's not that we don't love you, but some people just aren't as comfortable with this even with people they do know well.
